

NEW MATERIALS RECOVER FACILITY TOUR

District Staff toured The Rumpke
Resource & Recycling Center - the
largest and most technically advanced
recycling facility in North America, now
open in Columbus, Ohio! The \$100
million facility is 226,000 square feet
and features state-of-the-art Machinex
recycling machinery, including 19
optical scanners, artificial intelligence
and ballistic separators. The
equipment sorts 60-70 tons of
recycling per hour and can process up
to 250,000 tons annually from over 50
Ohio counties.

DISTRICT PLAN UPDATE

The District held their final policy committee meeting on September 12th to complete the final step of the plan update. The Policy Committee passed a resolution certifying the plan was properly ratified and was submitted to the Ohio EPA for final approval. The Ohio EPA has 90 days to evaluate the plan submitted by the District.
